Please see page 11 for information on a possible road closure on the grindstone road as well as some operational changes at the Commodity Station.

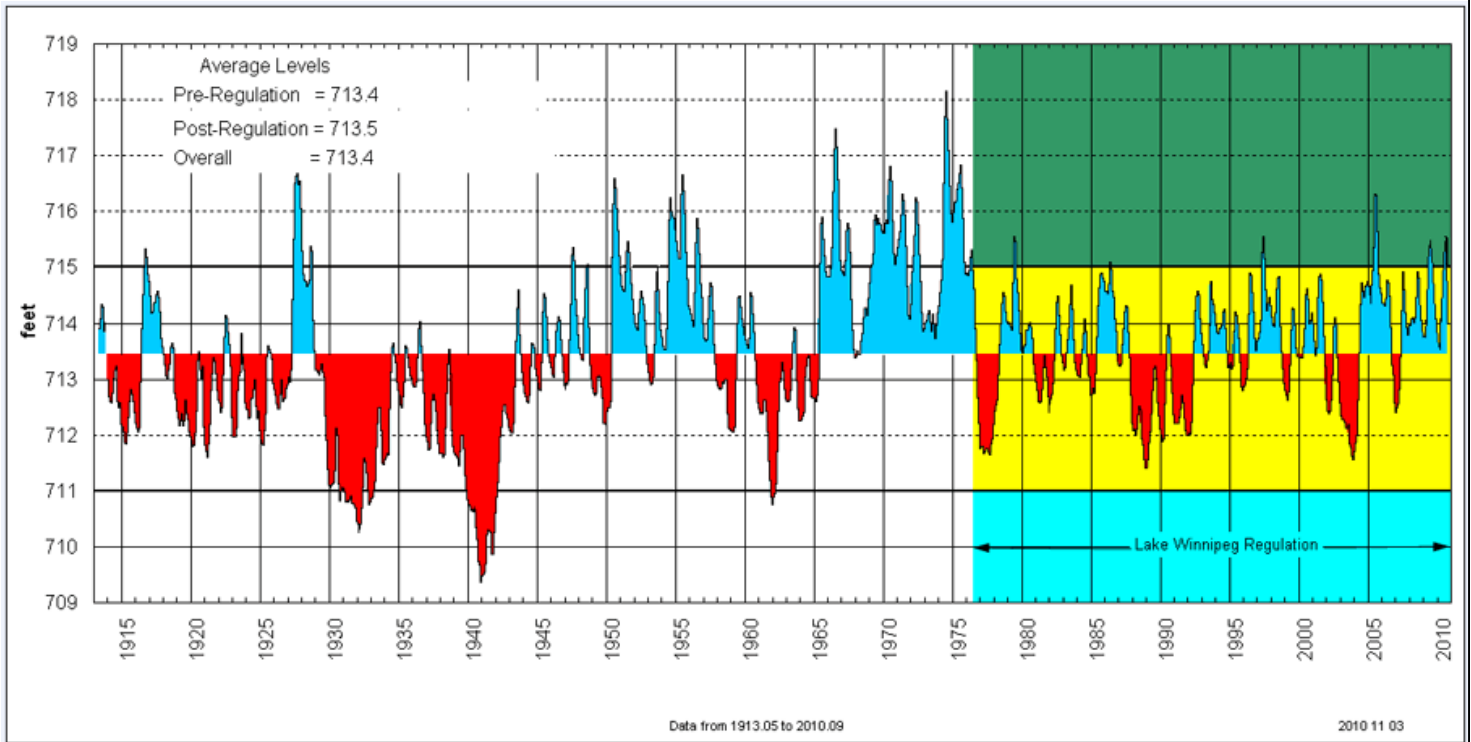

Save Our Lake Report June 2011

Everyone who was able to attend the AGM was treated to an excellent presentation by Manitoba Hydro on lake water levels and their regulations, which are overseen by the Province.

Their talk clearly illustrated that levels, and fluctuations thereof, are far less dramatic (highs and lows) than before regulation and that their constructing of additional channels for drainage out of the Lake at the north end have vastly improved the quantity of water flowing north. In fact, the flow out has been maintained at maximum since last June. The huge increase of precipitation all over the watershed, the removal of wetlands as a sink for excess water and the construction of straight drainage ditches across the agricultural fields of Manitoba are, all combined, the main factors for the high water levels and increase in nutrient loading. The high precipitation could be a sign of things to come and cannot be controlled by humans.

On another note, SOUL at the AGM indicated that they would like to set up an Environmental lending library of books and magazines at Grindstone. The matter was discussed at a Board meeting and permission has been granted to run a pilot trial. The library would be on an 'Honor' system, with hard cover books being on a 'Sign In and Out' basis. If you have any books that you are willing to loan out for this purpose, please contact motipples@shaw.ca. Books should have the owner's name (first and last) printed inside.

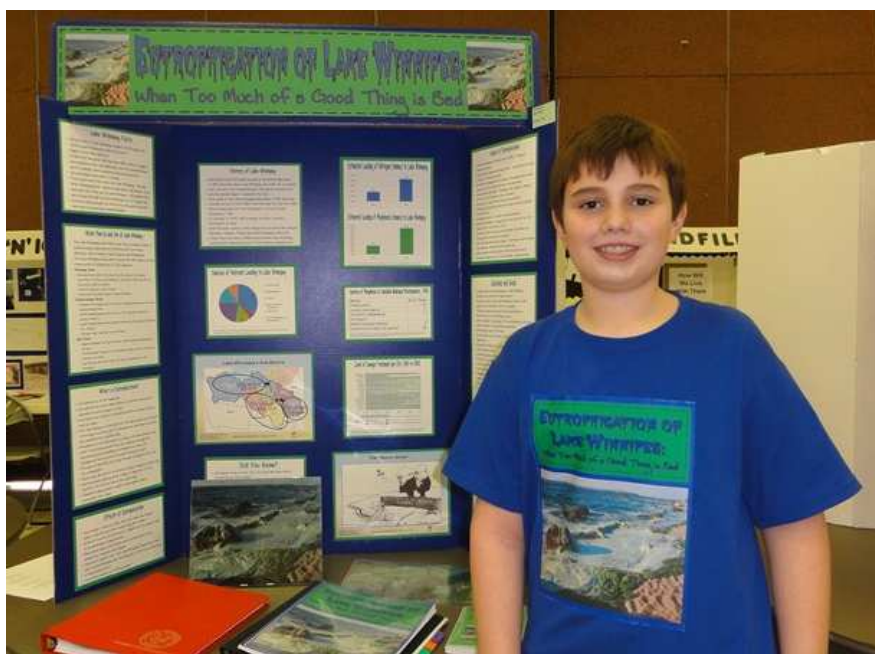
Lastly, the **2011 Manitoba Schools Science Symposium** was held in late April. Once again, the GCOA, through SOUL, awarded two very deserving prizes. Steven Olson, in grade 8 showed, much knowledge and concern in his project named "Water Matters", which indicated his wide depth of understanding on these issues from Lake Winnipeg to far underdeveloped countries. Brennan Siemens, also in grade 8, in his project "The Eutrophication of Lake Winnipeg" presented a quite remarkable knowledge of facts and issues about our Lake and watershed; how and why the problems exist and what remediation can be done. Both boys are from Linden Christian School and are good friends. They were unaware of each others projects until the first day of school in January, when they learned that their two projects were on **Water** and provided a perfect foil for each other on this subject. Their prize includes a full-day trip on the MV Namao during the summer months, courtesy of the Lake Winnipeg Research Consortium.

It is cheering indeed to see students leading the way in their concern about our environment and should make us all keener to be as equally informed.

We are looking forward to the summer at the Lake. See you there!

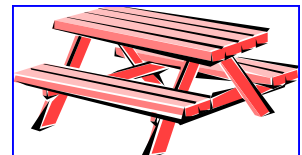

DEFIBRILLATORS COMING TO GRINDSTONE

A first for Grindstone! The GCOA is purchasing 2 AED's (**automated external defibrillator**) for the Grindstone area. We will have them set up in central locations. We are currently looking at the most suitable locations for them & we'll advise once known in the future. These will be available year round for the safety of all our cottagers.

For those that do not know what an AED does: AED stands for Automated External Defibrillator. This is an electronic device which; when attached to a patient via sticky pads called electrodes; analyzes the electrical activity of the heart, and allows a rescuer to deliver a shock to the patient if necessary. The AED is looking for two distinct cardiac rhythms, Ventricular Fibrillation (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ventricular_fibrillation), or Pulseless Ventricular Tachycardia (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ventricular_tachycardia).

When the AED detects either of these two cardiac rhythms, it will prompt the rescuer to push the "SHOCK" button, thus delivering an electric shock to the heart. This shock is intended to disrupt the abnormal rhythm, so that when the heart starts again, it will do so in a manner that allows it to move oxygen rich blood around the body.

It is also important to be able to perform the steps of CPR, or Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation. As soon as a shock is delivered, or if the

AED does not find one of the two shockable rhythms; it will prompt the rescuer to begin the steps of CPR. After a designated cycle of CPR, the AED will prompt the rescuer to stop compressions, and allow it to re-analyze the patient's heart rhythm. It will then advise if a shock needs to be delivered, or if CPR should be continued.

Grindstone Days: There will be multiple demonstration sessions approximately 1 hour each on Saturday only.

PLEASE NOTE: These are **only** demonstration sessions they are not a certification course. These demonstrations are just information and some practice pertaining to CPR and the use of the AED. There will be a sign up sheet with available times during the course of the morning on Saturday for anyone interested in partaking in the information sessions. Certified CPR and First Aid training sessions will be offered to cottagers in the fall.

I encourage everyone to participate.

We all care about safety and the safety of our loved ones.



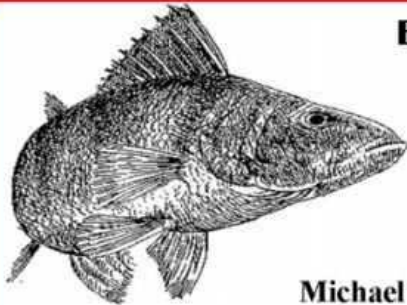

Little Grindstone Harbour Authority Report - May 2011

Another spring has sprung! There is going to be a lot of water around the harbour this year because of the exceptionally high run-off over the past months and the relatively high water table from the fall. The high water volumes are forcing the Harbour Authority to add extensions on to the steel poles which the docks are anchored too in the harbour. The extensions will provide additional security and protection of the docks with any north winds which raise the water levels in the harbour.

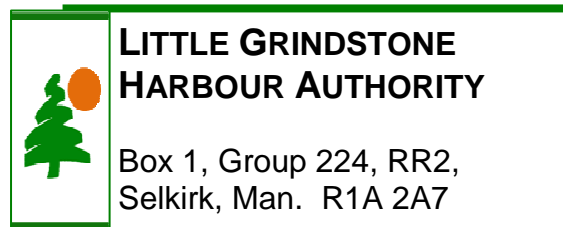
Carl Niemi has been working hard getting the docks in and getting things cleaned up from the weather bomb last October. The late melt has delayed his ability to get at this job and at the time of writing a lot of ice is still on the lake. The breakwater construction project was completed in March and we will be working with Small Craft Harbours to expand moorage in the future.

Once the spawning rates have been declared acceptable the commercial fishing season will open. With the late spring this may not happen until the end of May/early June.

A reminder to get your berth fees paid up with Harbour Master Don Bridges at the Grindstone General Store.

The Harbour Authority is again planning to hold our extremely popular Fish Fry during Grindstone Days. Further details will be communicated later on this summer.

NEWS FROM PARKS

COTTAGE LOT INSPECTIONS

Beginning in late May and wrapping up in June, Park Patrol Officers will be conducting inspections of cottage lots in the Grindstone subdivisions. They will be tasked to inspect the lots for the following:

- Fire concerns (illegal pits, large brush piles, ash piles)
- Derelict and unregistered vehicles (cars, trailers, campers, atv's)
- New structures (additions, decks, docks, gazebos) to be compared to files and checked for proper permits
- Garbage and bear smart concerns
- Park property (picnic tables and fire pits)

Cottagers who have items to be addressed will receive a letter indicating the shortfall of their lot inspection and the corrective action to be taken. Please ensure your lot is in compliance. If you have already undertaken a construction project without permits, please stop and report to the Riverton Conservation Office, we will help you get the permits that are required. Should you have any questions or concerns, you may contact Geoff Smith or Jim Fisher at 378-2261.

PARKS continued**ROAD WASHOUT:**

I want to thank the lady that was attempting to flag the sink hole just south of the store on the afternoon of Friday May 13th. I didn't get her name and didn't thank her at the time on site. She helped prevent what could have been a potential accident. Really appreciate that. The Park staff did an excellent job in doing that repair that evening.

COMMODITY STATION:

We are in the process of cleaning up the old transfer station. A dumpster is on site and staff have started the clean up. We will continue rotating dumpsters until done. We need to push back the brush pile in the transfer station. We are going to remove the rocks and install a chain and lock on the access to the new transfer station area, Bill will manage it. I will have the pit behind the lagoon pushed up as well. Our intent is to have contractors and cottage owners haul all lot clearing debris (stumps, over burden and large trees) to the pit behind the lagoon. Branches and general spring clean up debris can be hauled either to the transfer station or the area just north of the old transfer station (home of new transfer station). **All haulers to check with Bill.** Bill says "no more boats dropped off at the transfer station, please." The more money we spend in handling these commodities the less we can spend on roads etc.

GRINDSTONE TRAILS COMMITTEE (GTC)

GTC Report presented at the April 20, 2011 AGM

Activities of the Committee since the last AGM

- Cleared and maintained existing trails.
- Groomed all trails in the development so that they were usable for walkers and skiers.
- Coordinated the 2010 silent auction. Committee members will also assist with the 2011 silent auction.
- Negotiated with Parks to develop a multiuse trail around the pits by the old dump on the west side of the road. This will be a priority. A few benches will be built and placed on the trail.
- Improve existing trails by adding gravel. Most of the trails require additional gravel.
- Met with Interlake Snotrackers to explore options for grooming Washow Bay Trail and joining to the Riverton, Arborg, and Fisher Branch trail.
- The shed was stained and an outhouse was built for the shed site.
- Met with Park's staff to lobby for trails; four meetings.
- Met with the Minister of Conservation, the Honorable Bill Blaikie to lobby for additional trails. As a result, we have been given permission to:
 - Mark a walking, skiing, snowmobile trail across from the store by the pits
 - Mark a snowmobile trail from Black's Point to Mile Ten
 - Mark a snowmobile trail from Black's Point to the gravel pits
 - Explore a walking trail from Little Grindstone Beach north towards Big Grindstone Point. This trail would be along the lake.

Parks and the Minister's Office have indicated that the ATV trails in Grindstone will be in the area from the gravel pits to Muriel Lake.

Conclusion

Cottagers who bought snow passes were disappointed that Parks did not groom the trail to Washow Bay. Volunteers cleared all the fallen trees and packed the trail for the groomer. This is the only trail on Grindstone that Parks normally grooms. This trail has been groomed every year since it was developed. This trail is not only used by cottagers, it is used by snowmobilers coming from Hecla and going to the Arborg, Riverton and Fisher Branch trails.

If the work that has been started is to continue, more volunteers are required. If anyone is interested to be on the Committee or help in anyway, contact one of the present committee members. This year very little has been done on the trails because the fall was wet and with the early and heavy snowfall it was almost impossible to do any marking. Gil is the coordinator of trail projects. However, another coordinator is required as people are away and don't always come to the cottage. Work on the trails can be done by anyone. However, it is more productive and enjoyable if more people are working together.

There are actually four trails that need to be marked and cleared:

1. Trail from Blacks Point to Mile Ten, the warming shed
2. Trail around the ponds across from the store on the west side of the main road
3. Trail from the pond trail to the gravel pits and the Muriel Lake Trail
4. Trail from Little Grindstone Beach along the lake north towards Big Grindstone

If these projects are to come to fruition, this will entail a lot of coordination and work. It was suggested that separate crews take on each of the phases. Each phase should have a coordinator and volunteers to work on that specific phase. That does not preclude the same volunteers from working on more than one phase.

MANITOBA BAT BLITZ RESULTS:

The MB Bat Blitz got back to us with some preliminary results from their Grindstone visit last summer.

Here's what they had to say: "We have not yet processed the blood samples but we did get some exciting information from the microchips. It appears that your bats hibernate at St. George Bat Cave which is near the Chief Peguis Reserve. It is the largest bat cave in the province with over 8000 bats and 8/10 were picked up by a scanner we had placed in the entrance of the cave.

This was a very exciting find, recapturing bats is very difficult and it will be interesting to know if your bats will all return to your maternity colony. We were really hoping to get back to your site this July, around the 15-20."

So cottagers if you know of any other bat colonies at Grindstone you could contact Kaleigh at the Manitoba Bat Blitz and they may be able to take samples from there as well.

French Onion Soup

INGREDIENTS:

8-9 onions (at least—more if you want)
 5 cans Campbell's Consommé Soup
 3-5 cans Water
 1/2 cup margarine or butter
 1/2 tsp. sugar
 1/4 cup Flour (add more if necessary)

OPTIONAL INGREDIENTS:

-Dash of black pepper
 -French Bread sliced toasted
 -Gruyere or Mozzarella cheese shredded
 -White Wine
 -If you don't want to use the bought Consommé soup which is the best way to make this recipe you can use your own stock.

This recipe uses only one cooking pot, so easy to make and a family favourite.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Peel onions and slice and chop however you want.
 - Heat margarine or butter in the pot and add the onions, cover the pot and simmer over a low heat till these are soft.
 - Add pepper whatever amount you want and the 1/2 tsp. sugar.
 - Sprinkle in the flour, blend it well with the onions, cook for 2-3 minutes stirring all the time. You now have a good base.
 -Add the soup and water gradually, still stirring all the time.
 -When blended cover the pan again and cook slowly for 30 minutes. You may have to add a can of soup more or a can of water more as it cooks. Depending on the number of extra onions you added. Make sure you always have more soup than water. Serve hot.

TO SERVE:

- A glass of dry white wine may be added to the soup pot before serving. If you want the soup to be a darker colour add one small drop of soy sauce.
 - Before you pour the soup you can place a piece of toasted bread in the bowl and drop some cheese on top of the bread.
